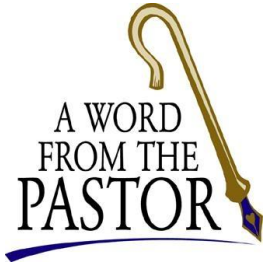

The Milk Man

When I first saw the photograph that goes with this message I couldn't stop looking at it. It really is quite a remarkable picture. The photograph is of a man delivering milk in London in 1940 after all the Nazi bombing devastated the city.

The man continues walking through the rubble on his daily rounds delivering milk despite the fact that so much all around him has been destroyed or damaged. Everyone has their job to do in peace time and in war. In the background in the photograph you can see firemen or soldiers working in the debris. But the man in the foreground of the picture was tasked with delivering the



milk. And that's just what he did!

I think sometimes today a lot of us feel the way that this picture looks. We try to do our jobs, whatever they are, the best we can. Moving ahead. One step at a time. But so much of what we once knew has been destroyed all around us. Ways of living, interacting.

Our whole society and world has changed.
I sometimes feel like the milk man in this photograph.

I am old enough to remember when milk men actually delivered milk in glass bottles to your door. Homes had little boxes by the door where the milk could be put in. You would take the milk out and put the empty bottles in the box for the milk man to take. I remember this in the 1950's and early 1960's when I was a child. By the time I was a teenager in the late 60's this practice had been curtailed.

One of the things that is endearing about the delivery of the milk bottles is that it happened every day. Day in and day out. Sort of like the newspaper delivery kid who would deliver your paper every single day on their bicycle early in the morning no matter what the weather was. This was before parents started driving the kids around or actually even delivering the papers themselves while the children slept in.

We are called to serve in the same way as the old milk man. Every day. Some days we feel more excited about what we are doing than others. Nevertheless there is a virtue to taking one step at a time, every day.

"I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in their toil." -Ecclesiastes 3: 12-13

Hymn of the Month for September

“For the Beauty of the Earth”

A spring morning in Bath, England, 1864. Violets and primroses dotted the rolling countryside as a young man sat atop a hill, taking in God’s creation. That man was Folliott Sandford Pierpoint, and the beauty before him stirred his soul to write one of Christianity’s most beloved hymns of gratitude.

Born in Bath, England in 1835, Pierpoint showed early promise as a scholar and writer. His education led him to become an accomplished poet, and he published several collections including “The Chalice of Nature and Other Poems” (1855) and “Songs of Love.” But it was a simple morning’s observation that would lead to his most enduring work.

Pierpoint was twenty-nine years old when divine inspiration met earthly beauty. Looking out over his native city of Bath, he saw more than just the natural splendor – he saw evidence of God’s love manifest in creation itself. The words that would become “For the Beauty of the Earth” flowed from his pen, each verse a celebration of different aspects of God’s goodness.

The hymn was originally written for communion services, published in a collection called “Lyra Eucharistica” – fittingly, as “Eucharist” derives from a Greek root meaning ‘grateful.’ Pierpoint crafted eight verses that followed a beautiful progression – from the physical beauty of creation to the spiritual beauty of the Church. His original refrain, “Christ, our God, to Thee we raise / This our sacrifice of praise,” drew inspiration from both the Book of Common Prayer’s post-Communion prayer and the Biblical text of Hebrews, connecting the hymn deeply to its eucharistic roots. The hymn tune that carries these words of praise is known as DIX, composed by Conrad Kocher in 1838.

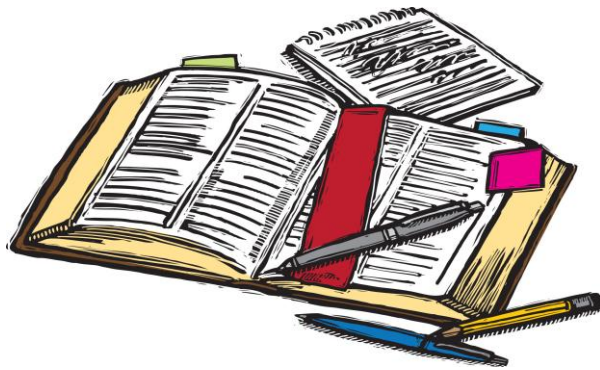

Weaving the Community Together

The second annual Weave Retreat will be held Saturday, October 3rd, 2026, from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. at Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church, 26 Owl Hill Road, Lititz, PA 17543.

The day will be spent assembling 12' x 12' crocheted or knitted squares into afghan-sized blankets. The squares can be made ahead of time, using any color yarn and any stitch of worsted weight, machine washable yarn. Because of allergies, it is requested wool yarn not be used for the squares. Once assembled into afghans, the afghans will be distributed to several local agencies and organizations serving those in transitional housing. Lunch and light snacks will be available throughout the day. Last year's event featured twenty-two people from nine congregations coming together to assemble twenty blankets. The completed blankets were donated to organizations in Lancaster County assisting with homelessness, including the Lancaster Hub.
