## Hymn of the Month for March

### “Just As I Am” - Charlotte Elliot

"Just As I Am" was written by Charlotte Elliot in 1835, first appearing in the *Christian Remembrancer*, of which Elliott became the editor in 1836. The final verse is taken from Elliott's *Hours of Sorrow Cheered and Comforted* (1836).

Charlotte Elliot wrote this song about how to find salvation through Christ. It has been used by many as the call to the altar at the close of services, as it brings a quite simple message of sin, forgiveness, and salvation to all that turn from sin and trust in Jesus.

Charlotte spent the first 32 years of her life in Clapham, England. As a young woman, she was gifted as a portrait artist and a writer of humorous verse. Then, in her early thirties, she suffered a serious illness that left her weak and depressed. She was an invalid and suffered much during the last 50 years of her life. In 1823, she moved to Brighton. She was a member of the Church of England. Charlotte was confined to her home and unable to attend church services.

During her illness, a well-known preacher, Cesar Malan of Switzerland, came to visit her. He asked her if she had peace with God. She was facing many inner struggles because of feeling useless, and she resented the question. She refused to talk about it that day, but a few days later called Dr. Malan and apologized. She said she wanted to clean up her life before becoming a Christian. Malan answered, "Come just as you are." She gave her life to Christ that day. Some years later at age 45, Charlotte remembered those five words and began to write the seven verses of "Just As I Am" in 1834. In spite of being raised in a Christian home, she reflected on her conflicts, doubts and was unsure of her relationship with Christ. So she penned her words of assurance about Jesus loving her just as she was. William B. Bradbury composed music for her lyrics and published the song in 1849. This hymn has been translated into many languages all over the world. Tens of thousands of people have committed their lives to Christ during the playing of this hymn, message of sin, forgiveness, and salvation to all that turn from sin and trust in Jesus.

# A Little Jewish History Lesson

## What does “Amen” mean?

We hear it all the time at Sunday morning worship or a Bible study. And every Sunday morning we sing the “*Three-fold Amen*” after the Benediction.

Pastors and Bible scholars know, but do you know what it means or the origin?

Many years ago in the Lutheran hymnals, an Amen was placed at the end of every hymn. It still appears in some other hymnals. Do you know there is a name for the musical Amen at the end of a hymn? It’s called a Plagal Cadence.

The word amen is a liturgical response to hearing someone else recite a blessing or certain prayers. The Hebrew root of amen, aleph-mem-nun (אמן), is shared with the word emunah, meaning faith or belief. Reciting amen is thus an indication that the speaker affirms the truth of what was said, an indication reflected in its common English translation as “verily” or “truly.” It is used in both religious contexts — as a response to a blessing or prayer — and sometimes to punctuate everyday declarations. Jews typically pronounce it ah-men rather than ay-men, which is more common in other faith traditions.

In everyday Jewish practice, amen is most commonly recited in response to hearing someone else recite a blessing. This is the case for blessings recited in the course of the thrice daily prayer services — for example, during the public repetition of the Amidah prayer, the congregation recites amen after each of its constituent blessings. It’s also the case for blessings recited in other contexts, including before and after eating and drinking. According to Jewish law, reciting amen with intention after hearing someone else say a blessing is akin to having actually said the blessing. It is through the power of reciting amen that one person has the ability to recite a blessing on someone else’s behalf.

The term itself originates in the Bible specifically in Deuteronomy, where the word appears at the conclusion of each of twelve successive verses at the close of the 27th chapter, each declaring someone as cursed for violating a particular commandment. After each one, the

text states: “And all Amen.” It also in duplicate (amen dividing that collection poems into distinct

Lowell Yost called the February meeting to order at 6:30 pm.


Vic Richard said a prayer to encourage council members to continue working together for the church and our community.

During the Lenten Season, our Discipleship in Life Committee is committed to helping raise funds for local organizations. This year, our Great 8 program is looking to help Samantha Patschke who is working for the Lord in Central America.

Dear Pastor Tim and friends in Christ,  
Warm greetings.

I hope this letter finds you well and filled with God's peace. It is with great joy that I write to introduce you to the Garífuna community where we serve, and to share a bit about our ministry and how you might partner with us in supporting the children we love.



The Garífuna people are an Afro-Indigenous culture living primarily along the Caribbean coasts of Honduras, Guatemala, Belize, and Nicaragua. Their heritage includes music, dance, storytelling and a strong sense of community, beautifully reflecting the creativity and resilience of our ancestors. Yet, like many communities, we face significant challenges:

### **Cultural and Social Challenges**

- **Language loss:** Many children are shifting away from the Garífuna language as they seek better educational and economic opportunities.
- **Economic hardship:** A large portion of families live below the poverty line, which makes access to quality education and consistent nutrition difficult.
- **Educational barriers:** Many schools lack adequate resources and students often struggle due to limited support outside of class.
- **Limited community resources:** There are few after-school or enrichment programs, meaning children often lack safe, constructive environments when school is not in session.

To address some of these challenges, we run a weekly **school ministry program** focused on spiritual growth, education and care.

Our program serves **two age groups:**

- **Kindergarten children** – meeting twice a month

•**1st through 9th graders** – also twice a month

Each time we visit the school we offer:

- A **short devotional**, sharing biblical truth and encouragement
- An **English class**, helping children grow in language skills that can increase future opportunities
- A **snack**, because consistent nutrition makes it easier for children to learn and participate



We are grateful that we have a sponsor who supports the English education portion of this ministry. However, we currently do **not have dedicated support for the devotional time and snacks** we provide each visit. To sustain the program for **all 200+ students each week**, our estimated cost is **\$100 per week**. Over the course of a typical school year (about **30–40 weeks**), we need **approximately \$3,000** to provide devotionals and snacks consistently.

We are writing to see if you might prayerfully consider being one of our donors for this ministry. Your support would mean joyful, nourished children, strengthened faith, and hope for many families in the Garifuna community.

Thank you so much for your time, prayers, and consideration. We are grateful for the body of Christ everywhere, and for partners who share our heart for serving His children.
