Pastor's Meditation

Ashes to Ashes and Dust to Dust

Years ago my wife Kimberley and I were with my brothers Tom and Dan at my parents' home in McKeesport, near Pittsburgh. It was good to see my brothers but the occasion was not a happy one. We were sorting through the house deciding what to take and what to give away. My Mom had passed away a year and a half earlier and it had been almost a year since Dad has been living at Country Meadows in Lancaster. The home was closed up.

I was certainly thinking about Ash Wednesday and how we are made from the Earth and return to dust. Our closed up home was full of dust....so much so that it caused a great deal of sneezing and wheezing. It occurred to me as we went through everything how, in fact, everything returns to the Earth, returns to dust. The windows on the back porch were coated with rust which has built up for just about fifty years. The memories were there but the things were not quite the same.

You don't have to be a Christian to learn that particular lesson in life. People of every faith and even people of no faith are aware of what happens with the passage of time.

The difference about having faith is that we have more than just memories of yesterday, we have the promise of tomorrow.

We hear Jesus saying this in the Gospel of Matthew, "*Do not store up for yourselves treasures on Earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.*" (Matthew 6: 19-21)

Many of the things in my parents' home are worthless to anyone else but are priceless to me and my family. I totally understand that the reason most of these items are so valuable to me is not because of what they are but because of what they *represent*. A book, a smell, a picture, an old letter, a blackboard on the wall in the basement still with names of all our friends when we were young as we played games, a chair....all of these things represent times and people and laughter and sorrow and a million experiences.

While I am aware that the value of these things is primarily symbolic, still I cling to them and cannot make the next leap from valuing articles to valuing what they represent to the next important leap of understanding the value of things as spiritual.

God blessed our work when we were at my parents' home those many years ago with a beautiful and gentle snowfall as we took some things out of the home and put them in a big truck. The dust of the closed up and silent house was wiped clean in the white beauty which covered all. And so our sins and our fears are washed away in Holy Baptism, like a gentle white snow upon the darkness of our hearts, upon the blackness of this ash.

I can still see my brother sitting on the back of the truck with the quiet and peaceful snow falling around him. I knew that some things were gone forever. But I felt God was telling me in the snow that He is constant and eternal and will always be present and in that Holy Spirit so will my Mom and my home.

Christ will comfort us in our sinfulness and give us peace in our trials.

From Martin Luther's great hymn "*A Mighty Fortress Is Our God*":

"God's Word forever shall abide, no thanks to foes who fear it;

For God Himself fights by our side with weapons of the Spirit

Were they to take our house, goods, honor, child or spouse

Though life be wrenched away, they cannot win the day.

The Kingdom's ours forever!"

As you recognize that dust you are and to dust you shall return, may you also always know the healing and liberating power of the mercy, forgiveness and love of your Creator, God Almighty.

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Hymn of the Month for March

“Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing”

Robert Robinson

Robert Robinson was a rather difficult, headstrong boy, and when his Dad died, things only got worse for his mother. So, when he turned 14 in 1749, his mother sent him to London for an apprenticeship. To no one’s surprise, he was just as much a troublemaker in London, and to make matters worse he gained some friends and followers as a leader!

When he was 17, he took his gang to a revival service where a well-known preacher at the time, George Whitfield, was speaking. But something happened that night that Robert wasn’t expecting. After hearing the message, it moved him deeply and it made him rethink his life and how he was living it. Nearly three years after hearing that sermon, a twenty-year-old Robert Robinson made his peace with God, and “found full and free forgiveness through the precious blood of Jesus Christ.”

Joining the Methodists, and feeling the call to preach, the self-taught Robinson was appointed by John Wesley himself to the Calvinist Methodist Chapel in Norfolk, England.

It was there, to accompany his sermon for Pentecost Sunday in 1858, the three-year anniversary of his conversion, he penned the words of the hymn: “Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing.”

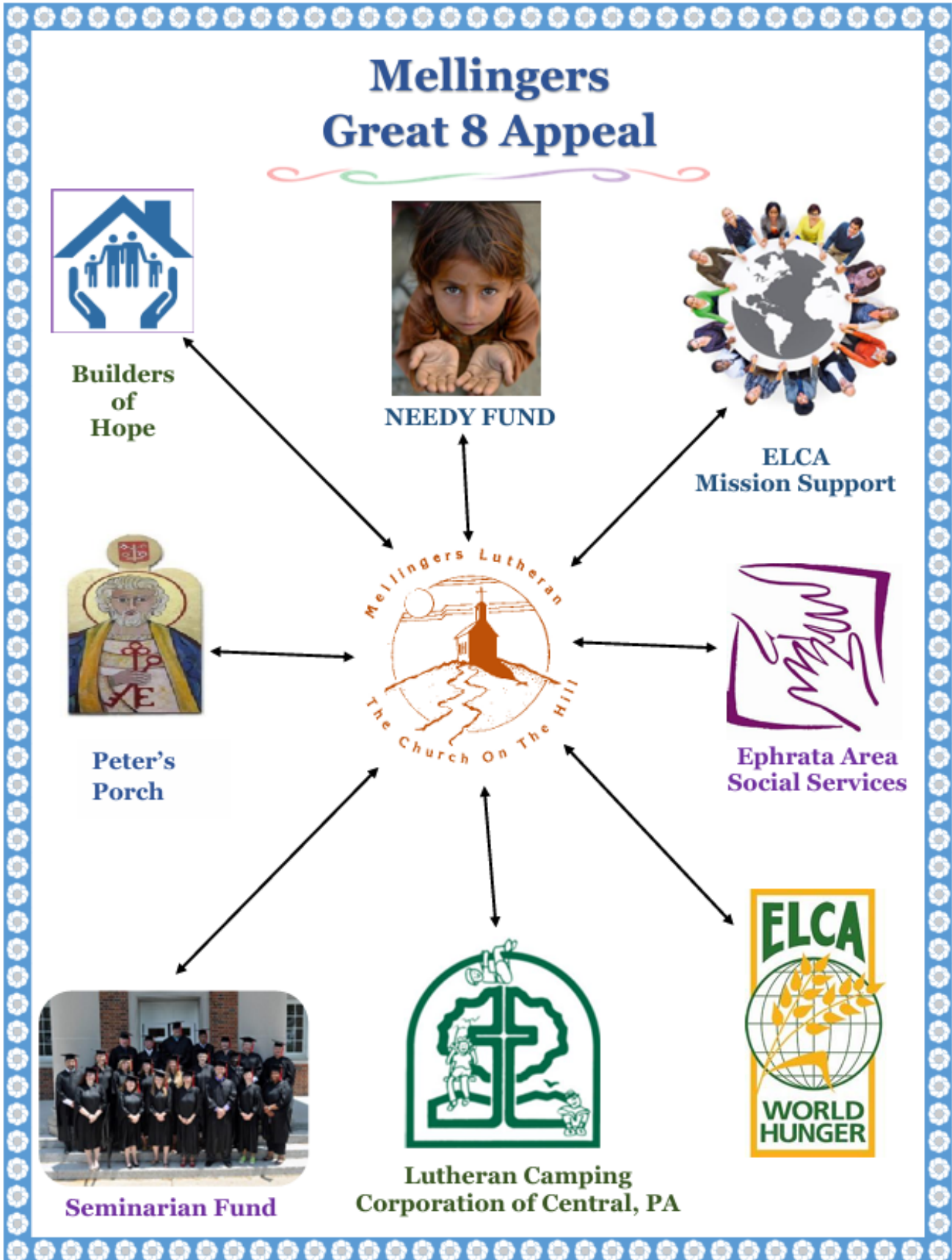

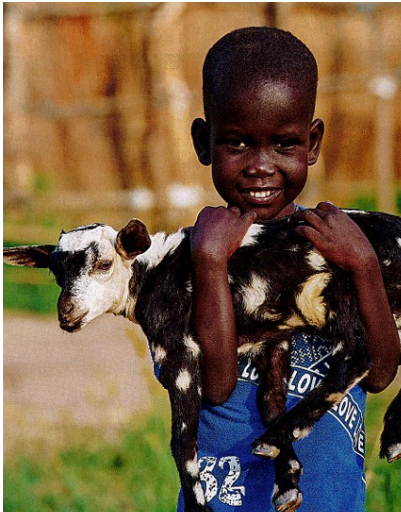

This classic Creamy Pea Salad with bacon is a delicious combination of sweet peas, bacon, cheddar cheese, red onion and a simple, zesty dressing. This simple side dish is perfect for the summer months and is a welcome addition to potlucks, cookouts, BBQs and baby showers!

Prep Time: 10 minutes Serves: 8

Ingredients:

Salad

- 16 oz Frozen Petite Peas
- 4 oz Sharp Cheddar Cheese, cubed
- 1/2 Small Red Onion, diced
- 1/4 lb Bacon, cooked and finely chopped

Dressing

- 1/2 cup Sour Cream
- 1/2 cup Mayonnaise
- 1 Tbsp Granulated Sugar
- 1 tsp Apple Cider Vinegar
- 1/2 tsp Salt
- 1/4 tsp Freshly Ground Black Pepper

Instructions:

1. Remove peas from freezer and place in a colander allowing to slightly thaw while preparing the dressing.
2. In a large bowl, whisk together mayonnaise, sour cream, sugar, apple cider vinegar, salt and black pepper.
3. Add peas, bacon, cheddar cheese and red onion. Fold / stir to combine.
4. Chill the salad for at least one hour before serving. The salad can be made up to 3 days in advance
